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The DHS questionnaire only includes limited information about disability. It is important to collect reliable information about the lives of disabled people and the UN Washington Group on Disability Statistics (led by the CDC) has developed and agreed six short questions on disability for use in surveys and the national census. The six validated questions about adult disability are below - a similar short question set about child disability is under development by the Washington Group.

Questions on Disability Endorsed by the Washington Group

Introductory phrase:

The next questions ask about difficulties you may have doing certain activities because of a HEALTH PROBLEM.

1. Do you have difficulty seeing, even if wearing glasses?

- a. No - no difficulty
- b. Yes some difficulty
- c. Yes a lot of difficulty
- d. Cannot do at all

2. Do you have difficulty hearing, even if using a hearing aid?

- a. No- no difficulty
