A preceding child (let's say j) is considered living at the time of conception of the child i if: **C1) j is born before the date of conception of i, That is: b3 j < dconcep i

**C2) j is living at the time of the survey, That is: b5_j==1

**C3) OR j died at or before the date of conception of i, That is: b3_j + b7_j <= dconcep_i But a child who died at or before conception of the next child is dead at the time of conception. The correct code should be

**C3) OR j died after the date of conception of i, That is: b3_j + b7_j > dconcep_i
