Body mass index (BMI), or Quetelet's index, for the respondent is defined as his/her weight in kilograms divided by the square of his/her height in meters (W/H<sup>2</sup>). There are two implied decimal place in the BMI (decimal points are not included in the data file). To produce the BMI divide by 100.
