Users are asked to tell us which DHS data file they are using, but not to send the file. We have access to all the data files.

I believe you are looking for variables m61-m69 in the NR and KR files. These variables focus on the mother's first postnatal check. There is not a variable for the number of such visits. The m7\* variables focus on the child's first postnatal check.

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
