Hi

I am analysing stillbirth risk factors from Uganda DHS 2011. I used variable v233 (Months pregnancy ended) to select any pregnancy termination within the preceding 5 years starting from January 2006- 2011. Out of this, I selected any pregnancy terminated from month 7 and beyond and it turns out that the stillbirth total is 383 compared to that presented in Uganda DHS2011 which is only 165.

I need guidance as to why my number of stillbirths differs from that of final DHS report. Did I use a wrong variable for computing stillbirth? And if it is the case, then what is the appropriate variable that should I use? The DHS report also computes a total of 8,240 pregnancies of at least seven months. I can't figure out how they computed this total. Can anyone help out, please. Thanks for your Help.
