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Dear User,

If you are interested in analyzing the last born child then you would want to use V401. M17 is asked of all the children in the three/five years preceding interview. However, M17(1) is the same as V401 which refers to the last born child.

You are correct. V238 Births in the last three years does not exist in the data set for India 1992-93. However they have the following:

V208 Births in the last five years

S225 Births since January 1988/89. (survey specific)

This was an early survey and at that time the standard recode (DHS-II) did not contain a definition

for Births in the last three years.
