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Hello, I have the same question. You suggest egen strata = group(v024 v025). However, this leads to 19 strata. The final report states there should be 34 sampling strata, and makes reference to island and non-island sub-regions.

The 2016 UDHS sample is stratified and was selected in two stages. Three regions (South Central, North Central, and Busoga) were stratified into island and non-island sub-regions. Each region/sub-region was stratified into urban and rural areas, yielding 34 sampling strata.
