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Following is a response from Senior DHS Stata Specialist, Tom Pullum:

If you go to the report on this survey (<https://www.dhsprogram.com/pubs/pdf/FR151/FR151.pdf>), Q706 on page 336, you will see that there is no category for "not working". The category labels do not have anything for "not working". I would agree that this is a defect in the questionnaire and the coding. You will also see that 75 cases are coded "99", and this is distinct from "don't know".

I would assume that these are the "not working" cases. However, there is no way to know this for sure.
